Vision: Greater DC Diaper Bank believes we can create, through actions large and small, collective and individual, a community in which families have all they need to thrive.

Today Greater DC Diaper Bank, using a proven model, provides diapers and personal hygiene products to social service organizations that are already helping families in need through comprehensive programs and services. Diapers act as a “gateway” to introduce hard to reach families to social services and other vital resources. The Monthly Project is a program to provide personal hygiene products to those in need.

Why Period Products?

Menstruation is costly. Not only are tampons and pads roughly \$7 per box, but in many states, including Washington, DC, they are also taxed as luxury items. Several recent articles have estimated the “cost of being a woman” at thousands of dollars over a lifetime.

Menstrual hygiene products are rarely donated to shelters and food banks. They are often forgotten and overlooked as being an essential, basic material need for people who have periods. Just like diapers, tampons are not covered by any government assistance program. Without access to tampons and pads, some are forced to use make-shift alternatives, and are at increased risk for health complications.

Zontians, please help women in need by **bringing tampons and sanitary pads** (all sizes) to the District 3 Conference.

GOVERNOR

1 Nominee

She is committed and passionate about ensuring that true gender equality exists – from equal pay to sexual rights, freedom from violence, access to education and maternal health rights. Although there has been progress across the globe - it is uneven. Pat strongly believes that each Zontian working collaboratively, activating new efforts in their clubs and with the district can lead the way for social change and the empowerment of all women.

Pat's commitment and dedication to Zonta is evidenced by the many roles she has assumed on the International, District and Club level. As a member of ZI's UN committee Pat began her work, and continues to this day, for the elimination of human trafficking- increasing awareness, implementing action, advocating. She currently serves as Lt. Governor/Membership Chair of District 3. Willing to try new approaches she has brought unique ideas to the role motivating members to improve their retention and recruitment efforts. Pat has truly enjoyed her role as Area 1 Director and the various positions she held at the club level – president, secretary, treasurer, director, chair of various committees. A member of the Zonta Club of New Rochelle, Lisa Burton has served as the Advocacy Chair, Service Chair, Treasurer, Secretary, Co-President and President. She is currently serving as the Area 1 Director for District 3. Lisa's professional career was in the field of law firm administration and financial services. After almost 30 years she retired as the Practice Group Manager of a New York law firm in 2015.

In 2018, Lisa came out of retirement to become the part-time legislative aide for her local Westchester County legislator. As a legislative aide, she is responsible for mentoring high school interns, investigating constituent concerns and researching proposed legislation.

Lisa is a member of the Bryn Mawr Club of Westchester, the New Rochelle League of Women Voters, the Westchester Black Women's Political Caucus, New Rochelle Against Racism and New Rochelle's My Brother's Keeper Safety and Second Chances Committee.

Dorothy J. Knauer - Zonta Club of Essex County

Dorothy Knauer has a distinguished career as a non-profit leader, and community advocate. She directed a large multi-service agency, engaging more than 15,000 volunteers and 24,000 Newark youths and families in positive, innovative youth development programs and partnerships. Dorothy is an adjunct professor in education at New Jersey State University in Jersey City, N.J. She is currently completing a Ph.D. in Urban Systems at Rutgers University Newark. She resides in Newark, NJ.

In Zonta, Dorothy has served in many club leadership roles, including Club President; and in District 3 as Area 2 Director (2013-2014), and Chairperson for Conflict Mediation and Resolution (2018-20). She treasures the many opportunities afforded through leadership, advocacy, service, and fellowship in Zonta International.

Jennifer Christensen - Zonta Club of Washington, DC

Jennifer Christensen has been a Zontian since 1994. She is currently President of the Zonta Club of Washington, DC and previously served as Treasurer, First Vice President and chair of the Service Committee. Jen was a member of the Zonta Club of Montgomery County from 1994 until the club disbanded in 2013 and served as Treasurer, Secretary, Vice President and President. Karen has attended multiple area workshops and district conferences and seminars. Throughout her career, she has held leadership positions advocating for women, minorities, and diversity and inclusion in the workplace. She has worked in corporations in public relations, marketing, business development, and administration. Karen holds a Bachelor of Arts degree

in Journalism from Temple University, and a Master of Science degree in Human Resources Management from The New School.

Mary-Helen Risler – Zonta Club of Annapolis

Mary-Helen Risler is a supervisory economist for a federal government agency in Washington, DC and leads a technical staff of economists, mathematical statisticians, and operations research analysts who conduct tax administration research.

Mary-Helen has been an active member of Zonta since joining the Zonta Club of Prince William County in 1993. In addition to serving on various committees and positions for the Prince William County club, Mary-Helen also served as club President. After relocating to Kent Island, Maryland, in 2003 she transferred her membership to the Zonta Club of Annapolis. She also served in many capacities in the Zonta Club of Annapolis including chairing club committees, leading fundraisers, and serving on the board of Directors. She was club President for a full biennium and then again for half of another biennium. Currently Mary-Helen is the Treasurer of the Zonta Club of Annapolis.
