SPOTLIGHT ON AREA 1 - Suzanne Scalcione



The Zonta Club of New Rochelle with the Friends of the New Rochelle Public Library are sponsoring a free documentary film series in March for Women's History Month. The club joined the New Rochelle Council of Community Services to network with health and human service agencies, and educational facilities to address community needs. They continue their monthly service project to feed the hungry, making lunch and distributing information about domestic violence and free legal services at Trinity St Paul Church. As a partner member of the New York State Coalition Against Domestic Violence, the Club will send a contingent of members to the Legislative Advocacy Day in Albany. They plan to continue to provide career tours for high school students including a tour with Danielle Hawkins, a NYC fashion st and Errol Louis, the political anchor for a Spectrum News TV show who will give a tour and discussion al TV journalism.

The Zonta Club of Long Island will attend a tour, luncheon and panel discussion at Vaughn College of Aeronautics & Technology for their Amelia Earhart celebration. They are preparing for their annual birthing Kit assembly day this April 21st (several thousand kits have been sent to Haiti & Africa to-date). The club is planning a Woman of the Year event for May and a paint and sip wine glass fundraiser for June.

The Zonta Club of Peconic Bay sponsored a soup-tasting fundraiser and were able to donate to Island Harvest, a food bank on Long Island. The club purchased and wrapped fifty journals and pens to donate to girls in the Butterfly Effect Project. This nonprofit community group works to empower young girls by giving them tools to help them achieve academic success and an emotionally stable and self-confident future. The club also has given two scholarships this winter: a scholarship for ongoing violin lessons to a high school student at East End Arts in Riverhead, NY, and a scholarship to a young woman, a native of Ecuador, who has been taking English as a Second Language courses at Suffolk Community College. They also are planning a third scholarship in March to a local high school senior who applied for Zonta's Young Women in Public Affairs Award.

The Zonta Club of Suffolk continues their monthly girl's empowerment workshops at Madonna Heights. On May 3, they are planning a fundraiser at a comedy club in Suffolk County and hope to sell at least 60 tickets. They also have another prospective member that has attended their business meetings.

The Zonta Club of Westchester continues to donate to 'Hope's Door' for sheltered women and children and to 'My Sister's Place'. The club has set up a table at a community fair to spread the word about Zonta. Recently they have participated in a program that sends needed supplies to women and children in Puerto Rico and their Night at the Opera was a huge fundraising success, so they have planned an event for the Spring.

The Zonta Club of Greater Queens enjoyed an Amelia Earhart celebration at Vaughn College of Aeronautics and technology. They are busy planning their Woman of the Year Event for May and their club's long range planning meeting is in June.

The Zonta Club of New York City will be hosting a dinner honoring the International President Sonja Honig Schough on March 15th during the 62nd Session of the UN Commission on the Status of Women. In April, ZCNY is holding a fundraiser, as well as a screening of 'Let it Ripple' as part of 50/50 day. The club is looking forward to their annual scholarships in June. The club is also helping to charter a new club in Brooklyn and a Z club in the Bronx.

SPOTLIGHT ON AREA 2 - Pamela Morgan

Area 2 celebrated Amelia Earhart Day in grand fashion on January 27th with a wonderful event organized by District 3 Amelia Earhart Chairwoman Sharon Jones. Approximately 40 Zontians from the Zonta Clubs of Essex County, Morristown Area, Northern Valley, Passaic Valley/Clifton, Ringwood, Sussex County and Trenton/Mercer and three members of the The Ninety-Nines: International Organization of Women Pilots met in the Administration Building at the Newark Liberty International Airport to commemorate the life and legacy of our sister Zontian Amelia Earhart. Amelia actually flew from the administration building during her heyday!

The event opened with greetings from Theresa Perry-Lewis, president of the Zonta Club of Essex County, and Zonta Club of Essex County secretary Ann Hoffner, a licensed captain who has sailed past the island where Amelia was reportedly lost. After the introductions the audience viewed the screening of "Amelia Earhart: The Lost Evidence," a controversial 2017 documentary by The History Channel that purported to have new evidence supporting the Japanese capture hypothesis of the disappearance of Amelia Earhart and Fred Noonan. Following the screening a keynote address was given by Dorothy Cochrane, who curates the collections of general aviation aircraft; flight materiel (specifically personal, business, and utility production aircraft); aerial cameras; and the history of general aviation and women in aviation at the Smithsonian's National Air and Space Museum. Cochrane provided an overview of the Earhart controversy, offering tremendous insights into the situation surrounding Earhart's disappearance. This was a very successful event where most of the clubs in the area came together for fellowship, education and celebration.

Additional club activities include:

Essex County – Held a raffle that raised funds that will go towards scholarships.

Northern Valley – AE, Service projects working on two service projects: to provide handbags for women in a particular agency so they have something decent to take when they go to interviews; purchasing intimate needs for women who are part of a shelter's outreach program; planning to go to a winery for a wine tasting; RAVE Walk coming up April 28th.

Passaic/Clifton - The club has mainly been concentrating on attracting new members to our club, and we are considering applying for the membership grant. Members have donated items to the Baby Steps Program in Passaic sponsored by the Passaic Mental Health Clinic.

Southern Ocean County – Looking to begin a Z Club.

Sussex County – Planning a membership event.

Trenton/Mercer - AE program; Awarded grants and scholarships to community organizations and worthy individuals; Donated toys and clothing to various individuals and organizations; Awarded \$500 for the YWPA Award to Clair Calvert Wayner of Baltimore, MD.

SPOTLIGHT ON AREA 3 - Jan Bryant

Zonta Club of Annapolis – The club held its annual holiday dinner at the Elks Lodge in Annapolis. Members, family and friends attended. At the dinner, members brought with them gifts for a family whose mother is undergoing breast cancer treatment. The club has been working diligently to prepare for its first ever designer bag bingo fundraiser scheduled for March 18, 2018. Ticket price in advance is \$25.00 and \$30.00 at the door. The club also has established an Instagram account and other social media presence which has helped with recruitment efforts.



Zonta Club of Philadelphia – After co-hosting a successful District 3 Fall Conference in September, the Club held its annual high tea event raising more than \$1,000. In December, 50% of the events proceeds were donated to one of the club's service project – Dawn's Place, which provides housing, counseling and advocacy services for women negatively affected by commercial sexual exploitation. The club is hosting a housewarming drive for its winter service project. The club collects toiletries, kitchen and bathroom supplies for the local woman's shelter Laurel House so that when the women leave the shelter, at least one room of their new home will be fully stocked.

Zonta Club of Frederick - In December, the club held its holiday pot-luck get-together and brought and wrapped gifts for 2 senior citizens identified by the local department of social services as someone in need. Members also collected gift cards for Heartly House, the local shelter for domestic violence victims. Zonta Club of Harrisburg-Hersey – The two major accomplishments of the Zonta Club of Harrisburg-Hersey were its annual advocacy event and its service event. The advocacy event was held on December 4, 2017 at the State Capital as part of the “Zonta Says No” Campaign that focuses attention on the issue of human trafficking. The service event – “Party with a Purpose” was held at the Club's monthly December meeting. This event was well attended and benefits the women and children living at Shalom House, Harrisburg. Zonta Club of Howard County – The club held its second membership drive and formal presentation to its recipient of the ZI Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship. In December 2017, club members participated in the John Hopkins Carey School Women in Business Alumni Networking event in Baltimore. The club is working on several fundraising ideas for 2018 and has a 2018 Women in Aerospace Event planned for February. This is the third year for this event that focuses on encouraging girls to continue studies in math and science and enter careers in aerospace science and engineering. Additionally in December the club donated 14 holiday gift bags for women victims and survivors of human trafficking. The effort supported the Howard County Advocacy Group Against Slavery and Trafficking (AGAST) and the club also donated bedding for urgent need at a shelter of the Grassroots Crisis Intervention Center in Columbia, MD.

Zonta Club of Mid-Maryland - In October and continuing throughout the year is the club's participation and support of “Free the Girls” organization. This organization's purpose is to eliminate sex trafficking. Members donated new or gently used bras. In support of Zonta's “16 Days of Activism Against Domestic Violence”. The club's advocacy chair, Felicia Sadler, led outreach events at three area locations over a 3 day period. The 3 events took place on 12/5/17 at Forest Village Park Mall (Forestville, MD), on 12/6/17 at Wegmen's (Woodmore Town Center) and on 12/7/17 at Starbucks. At each event, members handed out literature about the Zonta Says No campaign.

TREASURER'S LEDGER - Rosa Goldsmith

It's that time of year...Annual Dues for Zonta & Preparing for the next biennium

The annual dues a club member pays includes dues for: Zonta International, District 3, and their Club. The club treasurer must pay Zonta International and District 3 dues for your club by June 1, 2018 in order to have a club delegate(s) credentialed at the 2018 Convention in Yokohama, Japan. As a club member, please pay your dues on time to your club treasurer and verify your personal information is correct on the Zonta database website (MyZonta). This helps your club treasurer in paying the club dues on time to Zonta International and District 3.

As a reminder, the district dues have increased from \$13 to \$20 a year, beginning the next biennium for 2018-2020. In preparing the budget for next year and collection of the dues, club leadership and members should ensure this has been account for.

Outgoing treasurers - Make sure not to overwhelm the incoming treasurer with all the financial record boxes. Typical retention of detailed reports, receipts, bank statements, etc. for a non-profit or small business is 7 years. You don't need to hand over club records older than 7 years, except year-end reports, audit letters, and IRS filings. Please spend some time in properly training the incoming treasurer to prepare reports, timely payment of ZI & D3 dues, and to be aware of financial reporting deadlines.

Incoming treasurers – When taking over your club's financial responsibilities, please ensure on a monthly basis that: deposits are made timely; the club check register balance is reconciled to the bank statement balance; and prepare a current financial report for your board and membership. Remember to file your club's Form 990 e-Postcard by Oct. 15th and IRS Group Subordination Update form by Feb. 15th.

Just remember, if you or your club needs help with financial matters, Zonta HQ Accounting and I, your district treasurer, are both available to provide assistance.

Z and Golden Z Clubs are our future Zontians. The Zonta International Board approved a change of the Emma L. Conlon Awards from the 2018 Awards. One project in any of the three categories is allowed. Please help your Z and/or Golden Z club to apply for these awards. The money awarded can be used in their projects. Fairfax County and Prince George's Area County – you have clubs now chartered less than two years. Go for it!

Below are the 7 easy steps to start a Z or a Golden Z Club. It's repeated in this Newsletter because it is an important part of our future members.

7 EASY STEPS TO START A Z OR A GOLDEN Z CLUB

1. Step 1 could be the most difficult – it is finding the school's advisor for community and/or international services. Call the school and ask who that is. (Know that every high school and every college gives credit for students to do community and/or international projects.)
2. Schedule a meeting with the Advisor and explain Zonta and show the PowerPoint presentation for a Z Club. Copy and paste this into your browser. <https://www.zonta.org/Local-Action/Start-a-Z-or-Golden-Z-Club>
3. The last paragraph on the above page gives you the PowerPoint presentation to show.
4. Once the Advisor agrees, then you help her find students to join the club, at least 10 to start with a goal of +15.
5. Use the form in the second to last paragraph of the url in 2 above to request a form to send in to ZI for the establishment of the club.
6. Your club pays \$25 to register them.
7. Please let me know; I can send you more information, including project ideas for the new club. Special Congratulations to the Fairfax club who just chartered their new Z Club, Langley High School in McLean, Virginia. Congratulations to all of you who have Z clubs, a Golden Z club, and to those who are persistently forming one in their club area.

The Zonta International Board met in Oak Brook, Illinois, USA the 4 February 2018 at the Zonta International Headquarters Offices. We are happy to share the following information:

Audit

The Board is pleased to inform you that we received a “clean” audit for the ZI and ZIF Accounts for the year 2016-2017. A clean audit confirms that the financial statements present a fair and accurate picture of the organization and comply with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States. The audit results are posted at the website.

Contributions

The Board acknowledged the dedication of districts, clubs and individuals for their donations in the biennium.

- At the close of January, contributions totaled US\$3,477,844 which represented 65% of the biennium goal. Unfortunately, we are tracking below last biennium, so we need all your support to reach our biennial goal!
- The Amelia Earhart campaign brought in almost US\$8,000 more than last year. The total for 2018 was \$25,040.
- Everyone is encouraged to take the opportunity of the Rose Day campaign to bring in additional contributions.
- The newly introduced SEPA account in Europe brought in 25 donations during its first six weeks of existence. Using this account is a great way of paying less bank fees.

Risk

Risk tools have been finalized and can be found at the website under Tools/Risk tools. The aim is to give clubs and districts a basic understanding of risk and providing some simple tools to use.

Programs

President Honig Schough presented a report from her site visit to our Nepal project in cooperation with UN Women in January. Extensive social media coverage followed the trip. A report has also been shared at the President’s Corner Blog at the website.
